ABOLITION OF CAPITAL PUNISHMENT BILL:—

Clause 1 having been dealt with,—

Clause 2. (1) Sentence of death shall not be passed upon or recorded against any person for any crime for which if this Act had not passed he would be liable under any Act or Imperial Act in force in this State to suffer "death."

Abolition of capital punishment and substitution of other punishments.

(2) Any person who is convicted of treason murder rape or carnally knowing a girl under the age of ten years shall be sentenced to penal servitude for life, and in such a case section four hundred and forty-two of the Crimes Act, 1900, shall not apply.

(3) Where a person is convicted of any other crime for which, if this Act had not passed, he would be liable under any Act or Imperial Act in force in this State to suffer death he shall be liable to penal servitude for life.

[Read.]

FORTY-FOUR HOURS WEEK BILL—(Further considered):—

PART I.

PRELIMINARY.

Clause 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Forty-four Hours Week Act, 1925."

(2) This Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the Gazette. Short title.

(3) This Act shall be read and construed with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act, but subject to the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, "and so as not to exceed the legislative power of the State to the intent that where any enactment thereof would but for this subsection have been construed as being in excess of that power it shall nevertheless be a valid enactment to the extent to which it is not in excess of that power." Commencement.

(4) This Act is divided into Parts as follows:—

PART I—PRELIMINARY, ss. 1-4.

PART II—HOURS IN INDUSTRIES GENERALLY, ss. 5-10.

PART III—SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS, ss. 11-14.

FORTY-FOUR HOURS WEEK BILL—(continued).

PART II.

HOURS IN INDUSTRIES GENERALLY.

Clause 5. (1) The ordinary working hours in all industries other than coal-mining to which the Principal Act applies shall be as prescribed in or under this section, and the following directions shall be observed by the court and the boards in making awards, and by the parties in making agreements—

(a) In all industries subject to the provisions of this section, the number of hours work ordinary working hours of an employee shall not exceed—

- (1) eight hours during any consecutive twenty-four hours ; or
- (2) forty-four hours per week ; or
- (3) Eighty-eight hours in fourteen consecutive days ; or
- (4) one hundred and thirty-two hours in twenty-one consecutive days.

“ Where a working period has been fixed by an award or agreement before or after the commencement of this Act, the working period shall not be altered to either of the longer working periods referred to in this section except by agreement or award made by consent.”

Where a short day or days or lesser working days than six in each week are adopted by an award or agreement for an employee or class of employees, the time worked on any day may be greater than eight hours per day, in order to allow the above-mentioned hours to be worked during the working period adopted by the award or agreement.

No employee shall be required to work on more than six out of seven consecutive days.

(b) The working time of an employee in a shift in underground occupations or occupations in which the conditions as to temperature, ventilation, and lighting are similar to those obtaining in underground occupations, shall not exceed six hours if for four hours of the working time of the shift the temperature of the place where the employee is occupied shall have exceeded eighty-one degrees Fahrenheit thermometer using a wet bulb.

Clause 11. The Principal Act is further amended by the addition after section twenty-one of the following new section:—

21A. (1) No order or judgment for the recovery of possession of any dwelling-house or shop, or for the ejectment of a lessee therefrom, shall be made or given unless—

- * * * * *
- (d) the dwelling-house is reasonably required by the lessor for occupation as a residence for himself or for some member of his family, or, in the case of a shop, the shop is reasonably required by the lessor for his own business, trade, or professional purposes or those of any member of his family, and in either case the court is satisfied that alternative accommodation, reasonably equivalent as regards rent and suitability in all respects, is available; or
- (e) the lessor is a municipal or statutory authority, and the dwelling-house or shop is reasonably required for public purposes, or for the purpose of the execution of the duties or powers vested in such authority.

(2) At the time of the application for, or the

* * * * *

- (f) the dwelling-house or shop is reasonably required by the lessor for the purpose of demolition or of reconstruction to a substantial extent and the court is satisfied that alternative accommodation reasonably equivalent as regards rent and suitability in all respects is available and that greater hardship would be caused by refusing to grant an order or judgment for possession than by granting it; or
- (g) the dwelling-house or shop is reasonably required by the lessor for the purpose of enabling him to comply with the requirements of a Local Government or Health authority; or
- (h) the lessee was in the employment of the lessor or a former lessor and the dwelling-house was let to him in consequence of that employment and he has ceased to be in that employment.

(3) An order or judgment against a lessee for the recovery of possession of any dwelling-house or shop, or ejectment therefrom, shall not affect the right of any sub-lessee to whom the premises or any part thereof have been lawfully sublet before proceedings for recovery of possession or ejectment were commenced, to retain possession under his lease or be in any way operative against any such sublessee.

3. (4) Where a lessor has obtained an order or judgment for possession or ejectment which is subsequently proved to have been obtained by misrepresentation or the concealment of material facts, the court in which the order or judgment was obtained may order the lessor to pay to the former lessee such sum as appears sufficient as compensation for damage or loss sustained by that lessee as the result of the order or judgment.

4. (5) Nothing in this section shall prejudice or affect the powers conferred by section 8B of the Vagrancy Act, 1902, inserted by section six of the Police Offences (Amendment) Act, 1908.

(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in section eleven of this Act the lessor may give notice to quit and take proceedings to recover possession of the premises in any of the circumstances set out in subsection one of this section.

(3) The commissioner shall receive such salary and allowances as the Governor may direct.

Other members of the commission shall be appointed by the Ministry by notification published in the *Gazette*, and shall not receive remuneration by way of salary or fees, but all members may be reimbursed such fares and out-of-pocket expenses, as are approved of by the Minister.

(4) The Governor may appoint a person qualified to be appointed commissioner to be a deputy commissioner for such time as the Governor may fix, and such deputy commissioner shall have and exercise such jurisdiction and powers of the commissioner as may be "prescribed."

(5) The commissioner shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor.

(6) Upon appointment the commissioner and each member shall take the oath "prescribed."

(7) Sittings of the commission shall be convened by the commissioner whenever he thinks fit or at the request of the Minister or a majority of the members.

(8) Two-thirds of the members of the commission shall form a quorum.

(9) The commissioner shall not vote unless the voting is equal, but in that case he shall have a casting vote.

(10) The registry of the court shall be the registry of the industrial commission, and the industrial registrar shall have such duties with respect to the commission and "conciliation committee" as may be prescribed. [Read.]

Clause 2. (1) The powers and functions of the commission shall include the following:—

- (a) to inquire into and determine any industrial matter referred to it by the Minister;
- (b) "once" in every six months to determine a standard of living and to declare what shall for the purpose of this "Act" be the living wages based upon such standard for adult male and adult female employees in the State or any defined area thereof.

In declaring such living wages the commission shall make a separate public inquiry into the cost of living of employees engaged in rural occupations mentioned in section 24B of "the" Act, and shall make a separate declaration as to the living wages to be paid to such employees, and shall declare what deductions may be made from such wages for board or residence, or board and residence, and for any customary privileges or payments in kind conceded to or made to such employees;

- (c) to hear and determine appeals under this Act. On appeals from committees the commission shall include the members, other than the chairman, of the committee appealed from;
- (d) to confer with any persons or industrial unions as to anything affecting the settlement of an industrial matter;
- (e) to summon any person before the commission for the purpose of conference or of giving evidence. Such summons shall be signed as prescribed.

(3) The industrial commissioner may sitting alone exercise the powers and jurisdiction of the court under Part VIIA, and sections eight, nine, ten, 26A, forty-nine, fifty-two, and fifty-five of the Principal Act, and the powers and functions of the New South Wales Board of Trade under the Monopolies Act, 1923.

Clause 8. (1) The Minister may, in the manner prescribed, establish conciliation committees for any industry or calling for which a board is constituted, or for any industry or calling for which for the purpose of establishing a committee the commissioner may recommend that a board be constituted.

(2) The commissioner may recommend to the Minister the combination, arrangement or grouping of industries or callings pursuant to section "sixteen" for the purpose of establishing committees.

(3) Each committee shall consist of such an equal number of representatives of employers and employees respectively as are determined by the Minister and appointed upon nomination as prescribed, together with a chairman.

(4) Where no employer or no employee in the industry can be found who is willing to act on the committee on behalf of the employers or employees, as the case may be, the Minister may appoint any person whom he considers to be acquainted with the working of the industry to represent the employers or employees on the "board."

(5) The chairman shall be appointed by the Minister and shall receive such remuneration as the Minister may determine.

(6) The other members of a committee shall not receive remuneration by way of salaries or fees, but all members may be reimbursed such fares and out-of-pocket expenses as are approved by the Minister.

(7) A chairman of a committee shall have the powers of a chairman of an industrial board.

(8) Upon appointment each member of a committee shall take the oath prescribed.

(9) The Minister may at any time dissolve a committee, and subject thereto a member of a committee shall hold office until the expiration of three years from the date of his appointment, unless he sooner resigns his office.

(10) A new committee may be appointed to take the place of a committee that has been dissolved or the members of which have resigned or have ceased to hold office.

(11) Where for any cause a member of a committee ceases to hold office, the Minister appoint a duly qualified person to his office for the residue of the period for which such member was appointed.

(12) Where a person is appointed to any vacancy on a committee, the committee as newly established may continue the hearing of and may determine any part heard case.

(13) The provisions of section twenty-two, fifty-six, "fifty-eight," and sixty-four of the Principal Act shall apply mutatis mutandis to, and in respect of members of, a conciliation committee. [Read.]

Clause 9. (1) A committee shall have cognisance of and power to inquire into any industrial matter in the industry for which it is established, and in respect thereof, may exercise the powers and jurisdiction of a board, and may make an order or award binding on any or all employers and employees in the industry.

(2) An award or order of a committee shall be signed by the chairman and forwarded to the registrar who shall forthwith publish the same in the *Gazette* and notify the parties in the prescribed manner.

(3) An order or award of a committee shall also in all respects operate as an award of a board and may be enforced as such.

(4) A committee may in its discretion determine that an award shall take effect from such day subsequent to the lodging of the application therefor with the industrial registrar as the committee may determine.

(5) From any order, determination, or award of a committee or upon any refusal of a committee to make an order or award an appeal shall lie in the prescribed manner, to the commission, on which appeal the commission may make such order or award as in its opinion the committee should have made. The pendency of an appeal shall not suspend the operation of an order or award appealed from unless the commission otherwise directs.

(6) At meetings of a committee, the opinion of the majority shall prevail, and where the members present are equally divided in opinion, the opinion of the chairman shall prevail.

(7) Where the parties mutually agree to such a course the chairman may send the proceedings to the commission for determination, and in dealing with the proceedings the commission shall include the members of the committee other than the chairman.

(8) Sittings of a committee shall be convened by the chairman whenever he thinks fit, or within three days of a request by the Minister, or "on application as prescribed", by two members of the committee.

(9) Subject to the regulations as to matters of procedure, a committee may make rules for the order and conduct of its business and proceedings. [Read.]

Validation.

Clause 2. (1) Any action taken by the Commissioners with regard to officers, whether by reduction or promotion in rank, position, grade or pay, or removal to other duties or places or otherwise in consequence of a direction given to the Commissioners by a Minute of the Governor, dated the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, is hereby validated.

(2) The re-employment of officers who were dismissed in consequence of the strike which occurred in the year one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, is validated, and section seventy-five of the Principal Act shall be deemed not to have extended or to extend to any such re-employment.

"Commission" means the Worker's Compensation Commission of New South Wales constituted under this Act.

"Compensation" includes medical and death benefits prescribed by this Act.

"Dependants" means such of the members of the worker's family as were wholly or in part dependent upon the earnings of the worker at the time of his death, or would but for the incapacity due to the injury have been so dependent, and includes a person so dependent to whom the worker stands in loco parentis or a person so dependent who stands in loco parentis to the worker. 1916 No 71, s. 4. cf. Vic. Act, No. 2,750, s. 3.

* + * * * *

"Fund" means the fund established by this Act.

"Injury" includes a disease contracted by a worker in the course of his employment.

"Insurer" includes any Government department, insurance company, mutual indemnity association, or person or persons, corporate or unincorporate, undertaking to insure or indemnify an employer against "liability" or any part of liability under this Act for injuries sustained by workers.

* * * * *

"Worker" means any person who has entered into or works under a contract of service or apprenticeship with an employer, whether by way or manual labour, clerical work, or otherwise, and whether the contract is expressed or implied, is oral or in writing, but does not include—

(a) any person employed "otherwise than by way of manual labour" whose remuneration exceeds "seven hundred and fifty" pounds per year; or

(b) an outworker; or

(c) a member of the police force; or

(d) a person whose employment is casual and who is employed otherwise than for the purposes of the employer's trade or business; or

"(e) a member of the employer's family, dwelling in his house."

(2) Any reference to a worker who has been injured shall, where the worker is dead, include a reference to his legal personal representative or to his dependants, or other person to whom or for whose benefit compensation is payable. Worker deceased—

(3) Where any person (herein called the "principal") contracts with any other person (herein called the "contractor") for the execution of any work by or under the contractor, and the contractor employs any worker thereon, the following provisions shall apply:— Contracting or subcontracting.

(i) Both the principal and the contractor shall be deemed to be employers of the worker.

- (ii) In the case of subcontracts, the expression "principal" shall extend to and include not only the original principal, but also each contractor who constitutes himself a principal with respect to a subcontractor by contracting with him for the execution by him of the whole or any part of the work; and the expression "contractor" shall extend to and include not only the original contractor, but also each subcontractor.

- (i) to supply timber and such timber is obtained from trees felled by the contractor or his wages-men (whether such trees are the property of the principle or the contractor or any other person); or
- (ii) to fell or ringbark trees or cut scrub or haul or load timber or haul and load timber; or
- (iii) to clear land of stumps or logs; or
- (iv) to thrash or harvest grain, or cut chaff or sugar-cane; or
- (v) to perform any other work or class of work specified by proclamation of the Governor and published in the Gazette;

and the contractor does not either sublet the contract or employ workers, or, though employing workers, actually performs any part of the work himself, the contractor shall, for the purposes of this Act, be deemed to be a worker employed by the principal.

* * * * *

(6) A salesman, canvasser, collector, or person paid wholly or partly by commission Salesman. shall, for the purposes of this Act, be deemed to be a worker in the employment of the *Qld.* s. 6 Geo. V. person by whom such commission is received by the salesman, canvasser, collector, or person *No.* 35 s. 3 for or in connection with work incidental to a trade or business regularly carried on by him "in his own name" or by a firm whereof he is a member "in the firm name."

(7) Notwithstanding any limitation in paragraph (e) of the definition of worker Share-farmer. "contained in subsection one of this section, every share-farmer and every worker, whether *cf. Ibid.* s. 3 "a member of the share-farmer's family or not, employed by any share-farmer shall, for the *(3c).* "purposes of this Act be deemed to be a worker employed by the owner of the farm."

* * * * *

(13) The exercise and performance of the powers and duties of a local or other public authority shall for the purposes of this Act, be treated as the trade or business of the authority. (*Further considered.*)

“(b) Where any person (in this paragraph referred to as the principal) advertises or signifies in any way whatever that he will accept any timber supplied to him or his agent any person (in this paragraph referred to as the contractor) whilst engaged in cutting the timber to be supplied to the principal, or whilst engaged in delivering the same, for the purpose of this Act, shall, if in all respects the conditions hereunder written are complied with, be deemed to be a worker in the employ of such principal.”

The conditions beforementioned are—

“(i) the contractor himself is engaged in cutting timber ;

“(ii) the contractor has notified the principal in writing that he will supply the timber which the principal has offered to accept, and the principal has in writing agreed to take the timber, if of the specified standard.

“But no compensation shall be payable unless at the time of the injury the contractor was actually engaged in or about the work of cutting or delivering the timber, and the cutting or delivery was his sole or main means of livelihood.

“In this paragraph ‘timber’ includes sleepers, piles, poles, girders, or logs.

“‘Cutting’ includes felling, sawing, obtaining, preparing, or doing any work in connection with timber, and ‘cut’ has a corresponding meaning.”

PART II.

COMPENSATION.

Clause 7. (1.) A worker who receives physical injury, whether at his place of employment or on "his" journey to or from such place or (being in the course of his employment or while under his employer's instructions) a way from his place of employment, and in case of the death of the worker, his dependants, shall receive compensation from his employer in accordance with this Act. Liability of employers to workers for injuries. cf. Qld., 6 Geo. V, No. 35, s. 9.

(2) Compensation shall be payable in respect of any injury resulting in the death or serious and permanent disablement of a worker, notwithstanding that the worker was, at the time when the injury was received, in a place not directly concerned with his employment, but forming part of the employer's premises, or acting in contravention of any statutory or other regulation applicable to his employment, or of any orders given by or on behalf of his employer, or that he was acting without instructions from his employer, if such act was done by the worker for the purposes of and in connection with his employer's trade or business. cf. 18 & 14 Geo. V, c. 42, s. 7.

(3) Provided that—

(a) the employer shall not be liable under this Act in respect to any injury which does not disable a worker for a period of at least three days from earning full wages at the work at which he was employed. But if he is disabled for that period, the compensation shall date from his receiving the injury; Waiting period.

(b) if it is proved that the injury to a worker is solely attributable to the serious and wilful misconduct of the worker, any compensation claimed in respect of that injury shall, "unless the injury results in death or serious and permanent "disablement," be disallowed. Serious and wilful misconduct. cf. 6 Ed. VII, c 68, s. 1 (2) (c).

(4) Where the injury is a disease which is of such a nature as to be contracted by a gradual process compensation shall be payable by the employer in whose employment the worker is or who last employed the worker. Industrial disease. cf. 1916 No. 71, s. 12.

Any employer who, during the twelve months preceding a worker's incapacity, employed him in any employment to the nature of which the disease was due, shall be liable to make to the employer by whom compensation is payable such contributions as, in default of agreement, may be determined by the commission.

The worker, or his dependants, shall furnish to the employer from whom compensation is claimed such information as the names and addresses of all the other employers who employed the worker during the twelve months preceding the injury as he or they may possess. [Read.]

such contractor and also such workers so employed shall, for the purposes of this Act, be deemed to be workers employed by the person who made such contract with such contractor.

(5) (a) Where any person (in this subsection referred to as "the principal") in the course of or for the purposes of his trade or business enters into a contract with any other person or persons (in this subsection referred to as "the contractor") under which the contractor agrees—

(i) to supply timber and such timber is obtained from trees felled by the contractor or his wages-men (whether such trees are the property of the principal or the contractor or any other person); or

- (ii) to fell or ringbark trees or cut scrub or haul or load timber or haul and load timber; or
- (iii) to clear land of stumps or logs; or
- (iv) to thrash or harvest grain, or cut chaff or sugar-cane; or
- (v) to perform any other work or class of work specified by proclamation of the Governor and published in the Gazette;

and the contractor does not either sublet the contract or employ workers, or, though employing workers, actually performs any part of the work himself, the "contractor" shall, for the purposes of this Act, be deemed to be "a worker" employed by the principal.

"(b) Where any person (in this paragraph referred to as the principal) advertises or signifies in any way whatever that he will accept any timber supplied to him or his agent any person (in this paragraph referred to as the contractor) whilst engaged in cutting the timber to be supplied to the principal, or whilst engaged in delivering the same, for the purpose of this Act shall, if in all respects the conditions hereunder written are complied with, be deemed to be a worker in the employ of such principal."

"The conditions before mentioned are—

"(i) the contractor himself is engaged in cutting timber;

"(ii) the contractor has notified the principal in writing that he will supply the timber which the principal has offered to accept, and the principal has in writing agreed to take the timber, if of the specified standard.

"But no compensation shall be payable unless at the time of the injury the contractor was actually engaged in or about the work of cutting or delivering the timber, and the cutting or delivery was his sole or main means of livelihood.

"In this paragraph 'timber' includes sleepers, piles, poles, girders, or logs.

"'Cutting' includes felling, sawing, obtaining, preparing, or doing any work in connection with timber, and 'cut' has a corresponding meaning." [Read.]

* * * * *
The definition of "injury" having been amended by leaving out all the words after the word "worker" in line 4 and the insertion of the following words instead thereof—

"at the place of employment, to which the employment was a contributing factor, but does not include a disease caused by silica dust."

"'Cutting' includes felling, sawing, obtaining, preparing, or doing any work in connection with timber, and 'cut' has a corresponding meaning."

Postponed clause 7. (1) Subject to this Act, accommodation proper and sufficient for the comfort and health of the rural workers who are employed and reside on the premises during their employment, shall be provided in buildings free of all cost to the "workers."

- (vi) Where the rural workers for whom sleeping and dining accommodation is required to be provided, include aboriginals, Pacific Islanders, or persons of any Asiatic race, a separate building shall be provided for the sleeping and dining accommodation of such aboriginals, Pacific Islanders, or persons of Asiatic race.

(4) where the person entitled to the immediate possession of the premises is a tenant, and he in order to comply with this Act or the requirements of any notice thereunder, provides a building for the accommodation of the rural workers he shall be entitled to compensation in respect thereof under the Rural Tenants Improvements Act, 1916, as if the building had been erected after due notice to and with the consent of the landlord: Provided that the tenant before commencing the erection of the building gives notice to the landlord in the prescribed form of his intention to so erect the building, and subject as aforesaid, the provisions of the Rural Tenants Improvements Act, 1916, other than section four thereof, shall apply in respect of the building.

(5) Where the person entitled to the immediate possession of the premises is a limited or qualified owner, he or his legal personal representative, as the case may be, upon the determination of his estate, shall be entitled as against the person then entitled to the premises to a charge thereon for such amount as then fairly represents the value of the building.

(2) Where in any year, in addition to a rate on the average annual value of ratable property under the Principal Act, the Council makes and levies a general rate on the unimproved capital value of ratable property in the city in pursuance of section four of the Sydney Corporation (Amendment) Act, 1908, the total amount leviable by way of such rates in respect of rateable property in Waterloo Ward and Rosebery Ward shall not be less than the amount which would be yielded by a rate of five pence "three farthings" in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such ratable property.

(3.) This section shall remain in force during the period of "ten" years next after the commencement of this Act, and no longer. [Read.]
