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The victimisation of the workers consequent upon the recent industrial upheaval.—*Point of Order*.—That this motion was neither urgent nor definite. A ruling was given by Mr. Speaker McCourt, on 29th June, 1905, on a motion to discuss "The cry of the workless." It was submitted that the present motion came within that decision, and was not definite. Mr. Speaker said the urgency had been decided by the five Members rising in their places in support of the motion. The ruling referred to was not a definite matter, but the present motion dealt with the victimisation of the workers consequent on the recent industrial upheaval. He ruled the motion in order. (*Mr. Dooley*), 141.
