PRECEDENCE OF GOVERNMENT BUSINESS :—

Motion made (*Mr. Bavin*), That during the remainder of the present Session, unless otherwise ordered, Government Business only shall be dealt with on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, 109.

PRECEDENCE OF BUSINESS ON TUESDAYS :—

Motion made (*Mr. Bavin*) That during the remainder of the present Session, unless otherwise ordered, General Business shall take precedence of Government Business on Tuesdays until 6 p.m., and after that hour Government Business only shall be dealt with, and that Notices of Motions and Orders of the Day of General Business take precedence on each alternate Tuesday, 369.

HOURS OF SITTING :—

Motion made (*Mr. Bavin*), That during the remainder of the present Session, unless otherwise ordered, so much of the Sessional Orders be suspended as would preclude the continuation of the sittings of this House after 10.30 o'clock p.m., on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday in each week, negatived, 160.

Motion made (*Mr. Bavin*), That during the remainder of the present session, unless otherwise ordered, the provisions of paragraphs (2), (3) and (4) of the Sessional Order adopted on 19th September, 1929 (which provide for the termination of sittings at 10-30 p.m.) are hereby suspended.—*Point of Order* (*Mr. Lang*)—That motion was same in substance as that negatived on page 160, and, therefore, out of order—overruled by Mr. Speaker, motion agreed to, 172-3.

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- That the urgency motion was the first in the process of suspending the Standing Orders and such a motion was in order before the Address-in-Reply had been adopted, 6.
- That it was not necessary to formally rescind a Sessional Order, the words of Standing Order 40, and the words "unless otherwise ordered" in the Sessional Orders allowed the greatest elasticity in fixing and varying the days and hours of sitting and the hour of adjournment, and a motion to suspend the paragraphs of the Sessional Order which provided for the termination of sittings at 10-30 p.m., was in order, though the House had some days previously negatived a motion providing for sittings after 10-30 p.m., 172.
- That a motion to disallow certain regulations under the Conveyancing Act, 1919, was irregular and out of order, as that Act, while providing for the making of regulations thereunder, contained no provision whatever for the laying of such regulations on the Table of the House, nor was there any means provided by which such regulations might be disallowed by the House. The House could express its disapproval of these regulations, but disallowance had a well-known technical meaning, and a certain well-defined effect, 354.

- That as the Sessional Order provided that Government Business only be dealt with, no motion under the 49th Standing Order could be entertained, 115.
- That a notice under Standing Order 175n of allocation of time for discussion of the Government Railways (Amendment) Bill was in order as far as the other stages were concerned, but it was in his discretion to set down the 3^d, and the notice should not cover that stage, 145.
- That he could not sustain a point of order "That the Income Tax Bill did not coincide with the resolution as reported from the Committee of Ways and Means" and the Bill was therefore in Order, 228.

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- That every Hon. Member who moved a motion had the right of reply after the closure had been carried, 104.
