unless it is established to the satisfaction of the licensing court that the occupation fee or the interest payable is reasonable and proper having regard to the particular circumstances existing in relation to the club.

For the purposes of this paragraph the expression “occupation fee” means the amount paid or payable by the club, whether as rent or hire or otherwise in respect of the occupancy of the premises.

And where the club is by the terms of the lease, tenancy, or license or by any other agreement expressly made liable, in addition to the amount so paid or payable, for rates, taxes, maintenance, upkeep or repairs, or for payment of any premium or fine in respect of the lease, tenancy or license, then the following sums shall be added to and deemed to be part of the occupation fee payable annually by the club, that is to say—

- (i) a sum equivalent to the amount for which the club is so liable annually in respect of rates and taxes;
- (ii) a sum equivalent to the estimated annual cost of repairs, upkeep and maintenance for which the club is so liable; and
- (iii) a sum equivalent to the apportioned part of any premium or fine for which the club is so liable.

Interest payable by the club upon any security or loan shall not exceed a flat interest rate of ten dollars (\$10.00) per centum per annum unless the consent of the Full Bench of the Licensing Magistrates has been obtained by the club to such borrowing in an application specially made for such purpose and heard in open court.

CHAPTER V.—SITTING AND ADJOURNMENT OF THE HOUSE

* * * * *

DAYS AND HOURS OF SITTING

40A. Unless otherwise ordered:—

- (1) The House shall meet for the despatch of business at 2.30 2.15 o'clock, p.m., on Tuesday and Wednesday, and at 11.00 10.30 o'clock, a.m., on Thursday in each week.
- (2) Upon the expiration of fifteen minutes after the motion for the Adjournment of the House has been made, the Speaker shall adjourn the House, without Question put.

No Member shall speak to such motion for more than ten minutes.

PROVIDED THAT ON THURSDAYS WHEN GENERAL BUSINESS TAKES PRECEDENCE OF GOVERNMENT BUSINESS AFTER 2.15 P.M. THE MOTION FOR THE ADJOURNMENT OF THE HOUSE SHALL BE DECIDED WITHOUT DEBATE.

ADJOURNMENT FOR URGENT CONSIDERATION OF SPECIFIC MATTER

49. (a) No Motion for the adjournment of the House under this Standing Order shall be entertained until the Formal Business shall have been disposed of and then only for the purpose of discussing a specific matter that should have OF RECENT OCCURRENCE AND OF SUFFICIENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE TO WARRANT urgent consideration; a Member desirous of moving such a Motion shall state the subject thereof in writing PROVIDE A COPY THEREOF to the Speaker at least thirty minutes before the time appointed for the meeting of the House and shall also deposit a copy of the Notice of such Motion in the box on the Speaker's desk before the conclusion of Formal Business.

(b) The Speaker shall advise the Leader of the Government or the Minister whose administration is concerned of any Notices of Motion under this Standing Order as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

(c) At the conclusion of Formal Business the Speaker shall take a Notice of Motion from the box and if he is satisfied that the matter is proper to be so discussed he will call upon the Member whose signature is appended thereto to move "That this House do now adjourn". If the Motion is supported by five other Members standing in their places, the Speaker shall propose the Question.

(d) In determining whether a matter is proper to be discussed, the Speaker shall have regard to (i) the extent to which it concerns the administrative responsibilities of Ministers of the Crown or could come within the scope of Ministerial action; In determining whether a matter is urgent the Speaker shall have regard to (ii) the probability of the matter being brought before the House in a reasonable time by other means; AND (iii) WHETHER THE MATTER IS SPECIFIC, OF RECENT OCCURRENCE AND OF SUFFICIENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE TO WARRANT URGENT CONSIDERATION.

(e) The Speaker may entertain points upon the question whether the matter is proper to be discussed and when he states whether or not he is satisfied that the matter is proper to be discussed he need not give the reasons for his decision to the House. There shall be no dissent from the Ruling given.

(f) The Member and the Minister first speaking shall not exceed thirty minutes, and any other Member or the Mover in reply shall not exceed ten minutes.

(g) No second Motion for the adjournment shall be made on the same day except with the concurrence of the House, obtained by question from the Chair, without debate.

(h) Nothing contained in this Standing Order shall apply to the usual motion of adjournment by a Member of the Government to terminate the sitting of the House.

CHAPTER VII.—ACCOUNTS AND PAPERS

* * * *

PAPERS LAID UPON THE TABLE

57. All Papers and Documents laid upon the Table of the House may be ordered to be printed without notice and without debate. Any such Papers or Documents ordered to be printed shall be considered public.

Papers not ordered to be printed may be inspected at the offices of the House at any time by Members, and, unless otherwise ordered by the Speaker, by other persons, and copies thereof or extracts therefrom may be made.

PROVIDED THAT A MINISTER PRESENTING ANY PAPER MAY AT ONCE MOVE, WITHOUT NOTICE, "THAT INSPECTION OF THE PAPER BE RESTRICTED TO MEMBERS ONLY AND NO COPIES THEREOF OR EXTRACTS THEREFROM MAY BE MADE". SUCH QUESTION SHALL BE PUT WITHOUT DEBATE.

Should Mr Speaker present any document he may, at once, put the Question "That the Document be printed", no debate being allowed.

CHAPTER X.—ROUTINE OF BUSINESS

ROUTINE OF BUSINESS

74. The House shall proceed each day with its ordinary business in the following routine. 1. Presentation of Petitions. 2. NOTICE OF MOTIONS. 3. PRESENTATION OF PAPERS. 2. 4. Questions. 3. Notices of Motions. 4. 5. Placing or Disposal of Business. 5. 6. *Formal Business. 6. 7. Motions under Standing Order 49. 7. 8. Motions and Orders of the Day or *vice versa*, as set down on the Notice Paper or as provided by Sessional Orders.

CHAPTER XII.—PETITIONS

PETITION TO BEAR CLERK'S CERTIFICATE

- 81A. 81. Every Petition shall be produced to LODGED WITH the Clerk at least one hour TWO HOURS previous to the meeting of the House at which it is proposed to present the same THAT IT BE PRESENTED and no Petition shall be presented to the House unless it bears the Clerk's certificate that it is in conformity with the Standing Orders.

MUST BE WRITTEN OR TYPE-WRITTEN

METHOD OF REPRODUCTION

81. 82. A Petition must be in writing or type-written, and no printed or lithographed Petition shall be received. EVERY PETITION SHALL BE WRITTEN, TYPEWRITTEN, PRINTED, OR REPRODUCED BY MECHANICAL PROCESS, WITHOUT INTERLINEATIONS, ERASURES OR CORRECTIONS.

PRAYER

82. 83. A EVERY Petition must contain the A prayer of Petitioners at the end thereof.

TO BE IN ENGLISH AND FREE FROM CORRECTIONS. OR ACCOMPANIED BY TRANSLATION

83. 84. A Petition must be written in the English language and must be free from interlineations or erasures. EVERY PETITION SHALL BE IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE, OR BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ENGLISH TRANSLATION, CERTIFIED TO BE CORRECT BY THE MEMBER WHO LODGES IT.

SIGNATURE TO BE ON SHEET ON WHICH PETITION IS INSCRIBED

84. 85. A EVERY Petition shall be signed by at least one person on the skin or sheet on which the Petition is inscribed.

AUTHENTICITY OF SIGNATURES

85. 86. A EVERY Petition must be signed by the parties whose names are appended thereto, with their names or marks written or made by themselves, and by no one else, except in cases of physical incapacity.

SIGNATURES NOT TO BE TRANSFERRED

86. 87. Every signature shall be written upon the sheets bearing or attached to the Petition itself, PETITION OR UPON SHEETS CONTAINING THE PRAYER OF THE PETITION and not pasted upon or otherwise transferred thereto.

TO BE RECEIVED ONLY AS FROM THE PERSON SIGNING

87. 88. All Petitions shall be received only as the Petitions of the parties signing the same.

FROM CORPORATIONS

88. 89. Petitions of Corporations aggregate must be made under their common seal.

NO DOCUMENT TO BE ATTACHED.—EXCEPTION

89. 90. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any Petition, except it be a Petition for a Private Bill, when the *Gazettes*, and newspapers containing the necessary advertisements, may be attached, with a copy of the Bill.

NO REFERENCE TO DEBATES

90. 91. No reference shall be made in a Petition to any debate in Parliament.

LANGUAGE OF

91. 92. A EVERY Petition shall be respectful, decorous, and temperate in its language AND SHALL NOT CONTAIN IRRELEVANT STATEMENTS.

TO BE PRESENTED BY A MEMBER

92. Petitions can only be presented to the House by a Member.

FROM MEMBERS

93. A Member cannot present a Petition from himself. PETITIONS FOR PRESENTATION TO THE HOUSE CAN BE LODGED WITH THE CLERK ONLY BY A MEMBER, BUT A MEMBER CANNOT LODGE A PETITION FROM HIMSELF.

MEMBER PRESENTING, LODGING TO AFFIX HIS NAME

94. A EVERY Member presenting a Petition LODGING A PETITION WITH THE CLERK FOR PRESENTATION to the House shall affix his name at the beginning thereof.

MEMBER PRESENTING, LODGING TO ACQUAINT HIMSELF WITH CONTENTS
—RULES TO BE OBSERVED

95. It shall be incumbent on a EVERY Member presenting LODGING a Petition (A) to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to any branch of the Legislature; AND (B) TO TAKE CARE THAT THE SAME IS IN CONFORMITY WITH THE RULES AND ORDERS OF THE HOUSE.

RULES OF THE HOUSE TO BE OBSERVED

96. A Member presenting a Petition shall take care that the same is in conformity with the rules and orders of the House.

NOT TO PRAY ASK FOR PUBLIC MONEY

97. 96. No petition shall, either directly or indirectly, pray ASK for a grant of public money.

MODE OF PRESENTING

98. A Member presenting a Petition, not being a Petition for a Private Bill, or relating to a Private Bill before the House, shall confine himself to a statement of the parties from whom it comes—of the number of signatures attached to it—of the material allegations contained in it—and to the reading of the prayer thereof; and the only question which shall be entertained by the House, on the presentation of any Petition, shall be "That the Petition be received," which question shall be decided without amendment or debate.

CLERK TO ANNOUNCE PARTICULARS OF PETITIONS LODGED

97. THE CLERK SHALL MAKE AN ANNOUNCEMENT AS TO THE PETITIONS LODGED WITH HIM FOR PRESENTATION TO THE HOUSE, INDICATING IN THE CASE OF EACH PETITION THE MEMBER WHO LODGED IT, THE IDENTITY OF THE PETITIONERS AND THE SUBJECT MATTER OF THE PETITION. THE TERMS OF THE PETITIONS PRESENTED SHALL BE PRINTED IN HANSARD.

NO DISCUSSION UPON THE SUBJECT MATTER OF A PETITION SHALL BE ALLOWED.

PETITIONS DEEMED TO HAVE BEEN RECEIVED

98. EVERY PETITION PRESENTED SHALL BE DEEMED TO HAVE BEEN RECEIVED BY THE HOUSE UNLESS A MOTION, MOVED FORTHWITH, THAT A PARTICULAR PETITION BE NOT RECEIVED, BE AGREED TO. ANY SUCH MOTION SHALL BE DECIDED WITHOUT AMENDMENT OR DEBATE.

PRINTING OF

REFERRAL TO MINISTER

99. The Clerk shall cause to be printed, as a matter of course, all Petitions received by this House (excepting Petitions for the introduction of Private Bills), unless it be otherwise ordered by the House: Provided that when several Petitions are presented substantially to the same effect, he shall cause to be printed only the one first presented, to which he shall append a statement of the number of other Petitions, the general designation of the party or parties to each, and the number of signatures attached. A COPY OF EVERY PETITION LODGED WITH THE CLERK AND RECEIVED BY THE HOUSE SHALL BE REFERRED BY THE CLERK TO THE MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE MATTER WHICH IS THE SUBJECT OF THE PETITION.

CHAPTER XVI.—BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE AND FORMAL BUSINESS

* * * * *

PRECEDENCE OF BUSINESS

122A. Unless otherwise ordered, and except during the currency of debate on the Address in Reply to the Governor's Opening Speech, General Business shall take precedence of Government Business each Tuesday until 6.00 o'clock, p.m.; after that hour and on Wednesdays and Thursdays, Government Business shall take precedence of General Business. Notices of Motions shall take precedence on the first four Tuesdays upon which the House shall sit and General Business has precedence. Thereafter Orders of the Day and Notices of Motions shall take precedence on each alternate Tuesday. GOVERNMENT BUSINESS SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE OF GENERAL BUSINESS ON TUESDAYS AND WEDNESDAYS AND ON THURSDAYS UNTIL 2.15 P.M. ON THURSDAYS AFTER 2.15 P.M. GENERAL BUSINESS SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE OF GOVERNMENT BUSINESS AND THE BUSINESS UNDER DISCUSSION SHALL BE INTERRUPTED AT 4.15 P.M. NOTICES OF MOTIONS SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE ON THE FIRST TWO THURSDAYS UPON WHICH THE HOUSE SHALL SIT AND GENERAL BUSINESS HAS PRECEDENCE. ORDERS OF THE DAY SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE ON THE THIRD SUCH THURSDAY AND THEREAFTER NOTICES OF MOTIONS AND ORDERS OF THE DAY SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE ON SUCCEEDING THURSDAYS IN LIKE MANNER.

Whenever the House stands adjourned over any such Tuesday THURSDAY or Tuesdays THURSDAYS OR THE HOUSE HAS BY RESOLUTION ORDERED THAT ON ANY SUCH DAY OR DAYS GOVERNMENT BUSINESS SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE General Business set down for consideration shall be transferred to the next succeeding Tuesday THURSDAY or Tuesdays THURSDAYS as the case may be so that all Business shall retain its relative position and precedence.

"GRIEVANCE" DEBATE

122B. ON DAYS ON WHICH IT IS APPOINTED THAT ORDERS OF THE DAY OF GENERAL BUSINESS SHALL HAVE PRECEDENCE, A QUESTION SHALL BE PROPOSED BY THE SPEAKER, "THAT GRIEVANCES BE NOTED", UPON WHICH QUESTION ANY MEMBER MAY ADDRESS THE HOUSE. SUCH QUESTION SHALL BE PROPOSED PRIOR TO THE SPEAKER CALLING UPON THE FIRST ITEM OF GENERAL BUSINESS.

NO MEMBER SHALL SPEAK TO SUCH MOTION FOR MORE THAN TEN MINUTES.

THE LEADER OF THE GOVERNMENT OR MEMBER DEPUTED BY HIM SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT OF REPLY TO EACH OF THE MEMBERS WHO HAS SPOKEN UNDER THIS STANDING ORDER.

INTERRUPTION OF BUSINESS

123A. (a) Whenever it is appointed that General Business shall take precedence of Government Business on any sitting day, and that after AT a specified hour Government Business shall take precedence of General Business, the Business under discussion shall be interrupted at the hour so specified.

(a) (i) If the interruption be in the House, the Debate shall stand adjourned and the Speaker shall call upon the Member in charge of the Business to name the date for the resumption of the Debate and the Member speaking shall have precedence upon such resumption.

(b) (ii) If the interruption be in Committee the Chairman shall leave the Chair, report progress, and ask leave to sit again on a day fixed by the Member in charge of the Business under consideration.

(b) At the moment of interruption GENERAL BUSINESS MOTIONS, Motions for the Adjournment of the House or the Debate, or in Committee that the Chairman leave the Chair, or report progress, shall lapse without question put. THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL NOT APPLY TO ORDERS OF THE DAY FOR BILLS.

Provided that if at the moment of interruption the question under consideration has been discussed at two sittings, such motion shall lapse. This proviso shall not apply to Orders of the Day for Bills.

(c) Provided further that if at the moment of interruption a division be in progress such division shall be completed and the result announced.

(d) The provisions of this Standing Order shall not apply to motions under Standing Order No. 49.

CHAPTER XVIII.—RULES OF DEBATE

* * * * *

TIME LIMIT OF SPEECHES

142A. Except where a time limit is otherwise provided in these Standing Orders—

In the House,—No Member shall speak for more than thirty minutes at a time on any Question in the House except the Mover of a Motion who may speak for forty-five minutes. In reply no Member shall speak for more than thirty minutes: Provided that with the concurrence of a majority of Members present on a Motion to be moved and determined at once without amendment or debate, a Member may be allowed to continue his speech for a further period or periods, each period not to exceed fifteen minutes.

In Committee of the Whole,—In Committee of the Whole House except as hereinafter provided, no Member shall speak more than three times on any one Question, nor more than twenty minutes on the first occasion and ten minutes on any other occasion.

This Standing Order shall not apply to the Leader of the Government, a Minister in charge of a Bill or Motion, or to the Leader of the Opposition, or to the Leader of any Party in the House ordinarily recognized by the Speaker, or any Member deputed by them respectively to act on their behalf.

EXCEPT WHERE A TIME LIMIT IS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THESE STANDING ORDERS, THE MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR WHICH A MEMBER MAY SPEAK ON ANY SUBJECT SHALL NOT EXCEED THE PERIOD SPECIFIED OPPOSITE TO THAT SUBJECT IN THE FOLLOWING SCHEDULE :—

JUDGMENT

HIS HONOUR: At a by-election held on 20th July, 1974, for the return of a Member of the Legislative Assembly for the Electoral District of Coogee, the respondent to this petition, one Michael Arthur Cleary, and the petitioner, Ross Buchanan Freeman, with other candidates sought election. At a general election some time previously the present petitioner had been declared elected but subsequently as a result of a petition by the present respondent a Court of Disputed Returns presided over by Slattery J. on 23rd May, 1974, declared the election which had previously been held on 17th November, 1973, "absolutely void". In the by-election necessitated by the order of Slattery J., to which I have made reference, the present petitioner, Ross Buchanan Freeman, was unsuccessful, the respondent Cleary receiving 13 385 votes and the petitioner Freeman 13 331. As a result, Mr Cleary was declared elected by a majority of 54 votes.

The present petition refers to the fact, which is not controverted, that a large number of voters were disenfranchised by reason of the fault of a deputy returning officer. The petition as amended states:

"The petitioner further charges and the fact is that the facts alleged in paras 5 and 7 thereof constituted errors and omissions on the part of the said returning officer and of certain deputies appointed by him in and about the conduct and supervision of the said by-election whereby the said 100 persons referred to in paragraph 4 hereof were improperly deprived of voting on the said by-election whereby the result of the same was or may have been affected."

The prayer for relief in the petition is that the Court "declare that the said by-election was absolutely void".

As indicated above the challenge to the poll is based on the submitted disenfranchisement of approximately 100 electors who resided in the subdivisions of Coogee West, Coogee South, Randwick, Clovelly, and Coogee. I think it correct to assert, and indeed it is conceded, that somewhere in excess of 90 of these electors did everything required of them by the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912, as amended (hereinafter called "the Act"), in order to register their votes, but because of what would appear to me to have been an inexcusable omission on the part of a deputy returning officer at the polling-place at Randwick West, that officer did not comply with the requirements of the Act to attest the "absent voters form of declaration" to be found on the face of the envelope which is delivered to an elector and in which the completed ballot paper ultimately is enclosed (s. 115). In due course, pursuant to s. 117 of the Act, the returning officer refused to accept the ballot papers in these envelopes for further scrutiny and rejected them without opening the envelopes. It is not argued that his actions were other than perfectly proper and correct in doing so. Thereafter the returning officer, in accordance with s. 120 of the Act, having rejected the absent voters form of declaration and the ballot papers therein, placed a stamp on the back of the envelopes indicating that the reason for their rejection was that they were "not witnesses", he tied them up and left them unopened in a bundle. These envelopes have been tendered in the case and have become exhibits E1 to E100.

In a small number of these 100 envelopes the vote is challenged specifically by the respondent on such grounds as the disentitlement of the elector to vote because he or she was not on the roll, or because of some informality other than the failure of the deputy returning officer to attest the form of declaration. I will make reference to these specific instances later but the substantial issue for the consideration of the Court is to decide whether the rejection by the deputy returning officer of upwards of 90 of these prospective votes may have affected the result of the by-election.

There is no dispute, as I have already mentioned, that the Returning Officer was correct in refusing to admit the ballot papers in exhibits E1 to E100 to further scrutiny and as I understand it, there has been no serious argument against the proposition that the correct test to be applied in deciding whether to declare an election void is

whether the election *may have been affected*. I would think that this is the correct test and that it is not incumbent upon the petitioner to prove that the election was in fact affected. This principle has been arrived at as a result of the examination of the history and interpretation of electoral Acts and is now well established. Reference need only be made to *Cole v. Lacey*, 112 C.L.R. 45, at p. 48, where Taylor J. sitting as a Court of Disputed Returns pursuant to the Commonwealth Electoral Act said:

"But as I understand the position the petitioner, in a matter such as the present, is not obliged to prove that the result of the election was effected and, therefore not under any obligation to allege in his petition facts shown that it was or that it is probable that it was. I base this view upon s. 194 of the Act which provides that: 'No election shall be avoided . . . on account of the absence or error of or omission by any officer which did not affect the result of the election'."

In *Dunbier v. Mallam* (1971) 2 N.S.W.L.R. 169, at p. 172, Hardie J. said:

"Section 167 recognizes 'error of, or omission by, any officer' as a ground for a declaration that the election was absolutely void; the language of the section as interpreted by the reported decisions, empowers the Court to declare an election void in cases in which the official error in fact affected or may have affected the result of the election."

Slattery J., of course, adopted the same approach in the previous litigation between the present petitioner and respondent.

It will be remembered that the respondent's majority was a majority of 54 and it is conceded that at least 90 electors in the electorate did everything they could and should have done to have their votes recorded, and it was only by reason of the fault of a deputy returning officer that they were disenfranchised. The headnote in *Chanter v. Blackwood* (No. 2), 1 C.L.R. 122, which was approved by Sugerman J. in the unreported case of *Campbell v. Easter* (12th June, 1959), reads as follows:

"If at an election the number of persons not entitled to vote who have been allowed to vote, or of persons entitled to vote who have been prevented from voting, or of both, is greater than the difference between the number of votes cast for the candidate declared by the Returning Officer to have been elected and that of votes cast for the candidate declared to have the next highest numbers of votes, the election is void."

In accordance with that statement of the law, which I would respectfully adopt, if there were no other alternative I would be disposed to say that the omission of the deputy returning officer of which I have spoken may have affected the result of this by-election.

Of course, the obvious and most practical solution to the problem with which the Court is faced would be to open the sealed envelopes and thus to ascertain with certainty whether the by-election had or had not been affected by reason of the exclusion from further scrutiny of these ballot papers in the envelopes, for whilst I am not unmindful of the importance of statutory restrictions directed to preserving the secrecy of a ballot, one's mind boggles at rejecting a solution for which common sense cries out. However, the effectiveness of such a solution could not weigh with the court if the general principles of the common law of elections, or the provisions of the Act, prohibited such a course of action. Indeed it is strenuously submitted on behalf of the petitioner that this course is specifically prohibited by reason of the proviso to s. 167 of the Act and that a proper interpretation of this section is a bar to the course suggested. Section 167 states:

167. No election shall be voided on account of any delay in the declaration of nominations, the polling, or the return of the writ, or on account of the absence or error of or omission by any officer which did not affect the result of the election: Provided that where any elector was, on account of the absence or error of, or omission by, any officer, prevented from voting in any election, the court shall not, for the purpose, of determining whether the absence or error of, or omission by, the officer did or did not affect the result of the election, admit any evidence of the way in which the elector intended to vote in the election."

The interpretation of this section is not free from judicial pronouncement but I venture to suggest that it has not previously been raised or debated in the exacerbated form in which the present problem is presented to me.

I am not unmindful of the general principle of the common law that elections should be free and as an ancillary principle that in endeavouring to secure this object, the secrecy of the ballot must be preserved. But am I forced to render necessary a third election contest by speculating, if certainty can be achieved without offending the proviso to s. 167 and without any damage to the secrecy of the ballot?

Two decisions of Courts of Disputed Returns on the proviso to s. 167 run counter to one to the other, but it would seem from the reported judgments that in neither case was the matter debated, because counsel in each case both invited the Court to come to the decision which it ultimately expressed as to the proper interpretation of the proviso. The two cases to which I refer are an unreported case of Sugerman J. (as he then was), *Campbell v. Easter* (12th June, 1959), and *Dunbier v. Mallam, supra*, where Hardie J. more recently presided over a Court of Disputed Returns. In the first of these cases Sir Bernard Sugerman was called upon to decide the effect on the validity of an election where 51 ballot papers were rendered informal because of errors or omissions of electoral officers as a result of which the ballot papers ultimately were properly rejected by returning officers. The errors or omissions consisted of not only errors in failing to initial pages but more importantly, so far as it affects the present case, errors or omissions arising from the absence of the certificate on the envelope of the attestation of "the visitor or of the returning officer or deputy returning officer". It was in considering this matter that Sugerman J. said at p. 7 of his unreported judgment:

"It cannot now be ascertained whether these errors affected the result of the election as to the last mentioned group of six votes because of physical impossibility, and as to the group of fifty-one votes because of a legal prohibition. The six ballot papers have become merged in the whole mass of ballot papers and it is now impossible to identify and trace them. As to the fifty-one ballot papers, it would now be physically possible to ascertain how each elector intended to vote by an examination of the ballot papers. However counsel concur in the view, and I agree, that such an examination for this purpose is prohibited by the proviso to s. 167 of the Act."

His Honour then sets out s. 167 of the Act and continues:

"Prevention from 'voting' in the section includes, in my opinion, prevention from casting an effective vote on account of some 'error of, or omission by' an officer and is not limited to such acts as, for example, excluding an elector from the polling booth or refusing to hand him a ballot paper. An elector whose vote, although he is given a ballot-paper and marks it, is thrown away on account of some error or omission of an officer, is prevented from voting in the relevant sense. The errors or omissions here in question were in that category and had that effect. The intention of the elector to vote in a particular manner remains evidenced by his markings upon the rejected ballot papers. To admit evidence of these markings would contravene the prohibition in the proviso against admitting 'any evidence of the way in which the elector intended to vote in the election'."

I would be very hesitant to disagree with such a clear expression of opinion by such an eminent judge as Sir Bernard Sugerman were it not for the contrary expression of opinion to be found in *Dunbier v. Mallam, supra*, in which case the late Mr Justice Hardie presided. The matter was again not debated, but counsel in the proceedings concurred in a view of the interpretation of the proviso contrary to that which had previously found acceptance by Sir Bernard Sugerman; Hardie J., expressing a view contrary to that of Sir Bernard Sugerman, at p. 175 said:

"Another preliminary point requiring consideration is whether, in dealing with the sixty-five disenfranchised voters, the court should look at the votes in fact cast by them for the purpose of ascertaining the effect of their disenfranchisement on the result. Both counsel in these proceedings concurred in the view that the relevant section, which is s. 167, does not preclude the court from looking at the ballot papers to ascertain in whose favour they were cast. They invited the court to deal with the matter on the basis that this does not constitute 'evidence of the way in which the elector intended to vote' within the meaning of that section. I am disposed to accept this interpretation of the relevant section. However, counsel drew my attention to the fact that a contrary construction of the section was adopted by the Court of Disputed Returns in the Lismore petition: See *Campbell v. Easter* (unreported, Court of Disputed Returns, 12th June, 1959). It is apparent that the language of the section requires legislative clarification to eliminate the possibility of the court being required to speculate as to how the disenfranchised voters intended to vote when in fact there is clear contemporaneous evidence of the way in which they in fact voted. I propose to adopt the construction of the section contended for by counsel."

Mr Reddy on behalf of the petitioner frankly stated that the particular question which concerns me was not argued before Slattery J. in the previous proceedings between these parties but he says it was accepted by that judge that no evidence of the intention as to how a particular voter would vote would be admitted. Indeed, Slattery J. merely concerned himself with the error of the deputy returning officer in failing to attest the voters declaration form as yet another circumstance demonstrating a general inefficiency in the way the election had been conducted. In any case, evidence of the intention of how the voter intended to vote would not have concluded the issue before him one way or the other.

Before turning to examine the history of the proviso to s. 167 I think it helpful to call attention to several references in the Act indicative of the desire of the Legislature that an inquiry such as this should not be conducted with the strictness and technicality of a court of law engaged in adversary litigation. It should be recalled that this Court's predecessor was a subcommittee of parliamentarians and to them was committed the supervisory functions of elections. In the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912, provision was made for the Speaker of the House to set up a committee of nine to be known as the Committee of Elections and Qualifications (*see* ss. 157, 161, 163, and 164). In 1928, the previous scheme was substantially altered and there was reposed in this Court the functions previously exercised by the subcommittee of parliamentarians. Section 161 of this Act set out the powers of the Court and it is pursuant to this section that the Court is presently asked to act. That section provides that the Court of Disputed Returns should sit as an open court and its powers should include the power "to declare any election absolutely void", and by subsection (2) of the section it is provided that:

"The Court may exercise all or any of its powers under this section on such grounds as the Court in its discretion thinks just and sufficient."

It would appear that the genesis of the proviso to s. 167 is to be found in a case *Kean v. Kirby*, 27 C.L.R. 449, decided by Isaacs, J. (as he then was) sitting as a Court of Disputed Returns and considering a general election for the House of Representatives concerning the electoral division of Ballarat. There the Act which gave the Court its jurisdiction was the Commonwealth Electoral Act, in which there was a section similar to s. 167 of our Act but without the proviso which is now found in that section. I do not think it necessary to set out the facts in any detail in this case for it suffices merely to mention that in that case certain voters had been prevented from recording a vote by reason of the actions of a returning officer and they had thus been disenfranchised. In these circumstances Isaacs J. thought it proper to hear *viva voce* evidence from these disenfranchised voters as to how they had intended to record their votes. In adopting this course of action he disapproved a dictum of Sir Samuel Griffith in *Chanter v. Blackwood* (No. 2), *supra*, at p. 131, where Sir Samuel had said:

"Suppose that, instead of 91 persons voting who had no right to vote, 91 persons who had a right to vote had come and claimed to vote, and were not allowed to vote. Clearly those persons would have been prevented from exercising their right to vote, and the election must have been declared void. I cannot see that any other result can follow when a number of persons, sufficient to change the majority into a minority, if they all voted against the candidate having the majority, have wrongly been allowed to vote. I cannot enquire how they actually voted."

In the judgment of Isaacs J. after an examination of the common law principles applying to elections and an examination of the legislation itself—and in particular the necessity of a petitioner to prove that an election had been affected by the circumstances advanced by him—Isaacs J. concluded that he was not prevented from calling evidence from the witnesses who I have mentioned above were electors who had been prevented from voting by a returning officer and it was for this reason that he called the witnesses into the box and addressed specific questions to them as to how they would have exercised their franchise had they been permitted to do so.

I would first wish to quote—and perhaps it is more relevant on another aspect of the matter—from Isaacs J.'s exposition of the fundamental common law principles of elections. I do not think it can be doubted that this is an accurate exposition of the law and, indeed, I have found it helpful in the course I have ultimately decided to adopt. The case to which I have been making reference is *Kean v. Kirby*, 27 C.L.R. 449, and the passage referring to the common law principles of elections is to be found at p. 459. Sir Isaac Isaacs there said:

"The fundamental common law principle is that 'elections ought to be free.' That basic principle was reaffirmed and enforced by the Statute 3 Edw. I, c. 5. It lies at the root of all election law. For centuries Parliamentary elections were conducted by open voting. Freedom of election was sought to be protected against intimidation, riots, duress, bribery, and undue influence of every sort. Nevertheless it was found necessary to introduce the ballot system of voting. The essential point to bear in mind in this connection is that the ballot itself is only a means to an end, and not the end itself. It is a method adopted in order to guard the franchise against external influences, and the end aimed at is the free election of a representative by a majority of those entitled to vote. Secrecy is provided to guard that freedom of election."

I turn to a further passage from the judgment and this is more particularly relevant to the matter at present under discussion. It relates to the decision at which Isaacs J. arrived to call into the witness-box and to hear evidence from electors as to how they would have voted had they been permitted to do so. At p. 461 he said:

"In the absence of express prohibition of such evidence I think it is admissible because its admission is in accordance with the general, well recognised

principles of evidence, with which the Legislature must be presumed to be acquainted; because it supports the central principle of the Act, namely, representation by free votes of the majority of the electors; because it does not violate any ballot actually cast; and because to exclude the evidence on a supposed analogy to maintaining the secrecy of the ballot would be to proceed, not upon a real analogy, but on a contradiction. Its exclusion would exalt the means above the end; it would defeat the franchise instead of protecting it. I therefore decide that the evidence is admissible."

A short time after the decision in *Kean v. Kerby*, *supra*, the Legislature introduced into the Commonwealth legislation the proviso which has now become part of our State Act and it would seem obvious that in introducing this proviso the Legislature took a different view from the views so forcibly expressed by Isaacs J. and wished to prohibit by the introduction of the proviso what it regarded as an improper intrusion on the secrecy of the ballot by other judges adopting the course which had been adopted by Isaacs J. in calling the electors into the witness-box and asking them how they might have voted at an election. It seems to me evident that the mischief at which the Legislature aimed to eliminate was the identification of an elector with his vote and particularly with the procedure adopted by Isaacs J. long after an election calling an elector, who had been debarred from physically registering his vote, into the witness-box to speak of the intentions he had at the time of the election. One need only pause for a moment to envisage the undesirable results which could arise from this situation and the circumstances which well might motivate the Legislature to attempt to avoid them. But what indeed has Parliament said and how should it be interpreted? I quote again from the proviso:

" . . . the court shall not, for the purpose of determining whether the absence of error of, or omission by, the officer did or did not affect the result of the election, admit any evidence of the way in which the elector intended to vote in the election."

Two interpretations are possible. There is the interpretation which found favour with Sir Bernard Sugerman where he said that "prevented from voting" meant "prevented from casting an effective vote", and there is the other interpretation that "prevented from voting" is to be taken to mean "prevented from recording a vote at all", that is, the marking of the ballot paper to indicate the preferences of the elector. The circumstances in *Kean v. Kerby*, *supra*, would be covered by the latter interpretation and indeed also other cases to which I have made reference in this judgment because they were concerned with similar sets of circumstances. This was the position in Chanter's case and also in *Blundell v. Varden*, 4 C.L.R. 1463, at p. 1479, where Barton J. said:

"This is not like the application refused by Griffith C.J. in the case last cited, where it was sought to refer to a private scrutiny the application for, and the counterfoils to, the postal ballot papers there held to be invalid, so as to find out for whom the holders of the papers voted. To yield to that application would have disclosed for whom certain named individuals voted, but it was refused as an attempt to infringe the secrecy of the ballot. No such danger exists here. We already know how each one of these votes was cast, but we know nothing at all, and cannot know anything, of the identity of the voters."

It was for this reason that Barton J. thought he was entitled to look again at the papers to see whether they would have affected the result of the election. Of course, there he was considering ballot papers which were initialled on the front instead of on the back, and quite properly this invalidated the vote, but he looked at them because he said the paper was so folded that the presiding officer could see his initials without disclosure of the voting for candidates. Sir Bernard Sugerman had decided that he was prevented from looking at ballot papers rendered invalid by the failure to initial or to sign them according to the statutory requirements applicable. But if this were so then not only was Hardie J. wrong in the views that he expressed in *Dunbier v. Mallam*, *supra*, but there are many cases where the judges in Courts of Disputed Returns have not adopted this interpretation, and indeed in the previous case between these parties Slattery J. did not adopt it because he did not feel in any way inhibited in looking at ballot papers to determine whether they were forged and so on. There can be no doubt the section is open to the ambiguity to which Hardie J. called attention in *Dunbier's* case and it is unfortunate for the parties in this litigation that the suggestion of Hardie J. has so far not resulted in any action by the Legislature. Were it necessary for me to come to a concluded view about the interpretation of the proviso I would adopt the interpretation of the section which found favour with Hardie J. and would interpret the words "prevented from voting in any election" as referring only to an elector who is prevented in any way from exercising his franchise and records no vote at all. In my view it is essential to differentiate, as the Act does, between the act of voting, which is the designation on a ballot paper of a candidate or candidates for whom the elector wishes to cast his vote, and a vote actually cast which may or may not be an effective vote. It is in the former of these cases, namely, the case where an elector has been prevented from voting by some error or omission of an official and when the elector's intention never having been indicated in this ballot paper, it is proper to say he has been prevented from voting. Looked at

in another way, once a voter has recorded a vote, whether it be a valid or an invalid vote, then he has voted, and I think the section, when it speaks of "the way in which the elector intended to vote" and prevents evidence being admitted as to that, it is not referring to an intention which is culminated in an act.

In this case I would prefer the view that regards the proviso as limited to the type of case I have mentioned. I think a consideration of the history of the introduction of the proviso also assists such an interpretation as well as an analysis of the Act itself. Nevertheless, I do not think it essential for me to found my decision merely on this interpretation of this part of the section, for no matter what is meant by the phrase "prevented from voting in any election", what in my view the proviso inhibits the court from doing is to admit any evidence of the way in which the elector intended to vote in the election. It will be noted that the proviso is in the singular and is suggestive of the avoidance of the evil which might come about if any particular voter is to be identified with his vote. It seems to me that in the circumstances as they exist in the present case I can permit evidence before the Court which will remove the question as to the possible outcome of the by-election from the realm of speculation to that of certainty. I feel I am enabled in the present circumstances to ascertain the manner in which the disenfranchised electors have voted—and this without relating their identity to the votes cast by them—and in so doing I can avoid the enormity of ordering but one more election.

What I propose to do, subject to any suggestions which counsel may wish to place before me, is, that apart from certain particular envelopes which are challenged by Mr McHugh and to which perhaps I will pay special attention later, I will have my Associate shuffle the envelopes entitled "absent voters form of declaration", exhibits E1 to E100, and then request Mr West, who is an officer who has assisted the Court from the Electoral Commission of New South Wales, to turn each envelope face downwards without looking at the writing on the front of it referable to any particular voter or any other writing thereon, and to open the envelope and extract therefrom the ballot paper and place it in a ballot-box which will be in the Court. I then propose to instruct Mr West to seal in a separate envelope the envelopes he has opened, being the envelopes which are exhibited before the Court, and to mark this envelope in such a way as to indicate its contents, to seal this envelope down, and I direct that it is not to be opened by anyone in the future, before its destruction, without my written consent. As to the ballot-papers which will have been placed in the ballot-box provided, I intend to peruse these and subject to such perusal to allow counsel for the parties to look at them and later, should counsel consider it necessary, to hear further argument from them. It may be that s. 161 (iii) would prevent my allowing them to carry out an inspection of the documents outside the Court in the presence of the electoral officer.

I think I should also mention in this judgment that as a result of a suggestion by counsel for the petitioner I indicated to the Electoral Commissioner for New South Wales the probability of my following the course which I now propose to follow and he has intimated that he does not wish to intervene or be heard on this matter.

(When all the steps outlined above had been taken, Mr Reddy conceded that an inspection of the ballot-papers revealed that there would have been little change in the ultimate result of the election, had the ballot papers been admitted to further scrutiny.

His Honour accordingly made the following orders.)

After an inspection of 95 ballot papers, Mr Reddy on behalf of the petitioner has, quite properly, conceded that it has been revealed that there would have been little change in the ultimate result had these ballot papers been admitted to further scrutiny. Having regard to this concession, I dismiss the petition because it has been proved that the result of the by-election would not have been affected. I propose to order that the petitioner pay the respondent's costs but I recommend that the costs of the petitioner, and those which he has been ordered to pay of the successful respondent, be paid by the Crown. I take this action because I think it was proper that Mr Freeman, the petitioner, should have brought the matter before the court, not only by reason of the circumstances but by reason of the strong support he had for the legal view which was maintained by his counsel that this court should not have taken the course it did of opening the envelopes.

Regrettable though the necessity for this litigation was, it was due entirely to what I have described as the inexcusable failure of a deputy returning officer to sign the envelopes of the rejected absentee votes. This was in the background of the previous case in a Court of Disputed Returns between these two same gentlemen resulting from the general election conducted in November of last year. In that previous case my brother Slattery J. said:

"The omission by returning officers or deputies to attest absent voters declarations which make electors' efforts to cast votes futile are to be deprecated. Every effort should be made to ensure that any carelessness of this nature is not repeated in the electoral system" (p. 49).

Despite this caution it unfortunately has been repeated.

To disenfranchise somewhere in the order of 100 voters is a serious matter but the risk of negligence rendering a further election necessary is a matter of even greater concern. Parliamentary government depends upon the conduct of elections according to the procedures laid down, and the justice of them should be as obvious as the justice of the courts. This case illustrates the concern one must feel when a by-election rendered necessary by the determination of a previous Court of Disputed Returns in which a judge had declared that the new election was brought about because of circumstances resulting from the inefficiency and incompetence of electoral staff and then the same position might well have been repeated in this present case and again because of the carelessness of an electoral official. But one even more worrying aspect is the thought—and I emphasize there is certainly no evidence of this in the present case—that it might be possible for a single electoral officer, if so inclined, deliberately to negate any election.

The deposit is to be returned. The documents handed to the Prothonotary by the Clerk of the House, which the Prothonotary forwarded to the court, are to be returned to the Prothonotary for return to the Clerk of the House, together with any other material made available by him.
